

# Connecting to Suffolk University's wireless WPA2 networks on Blackberry Curve 9330

This Quickstart Guide will help you to connect to WPA2, Suffolk University's secured wireless Network for faculty, staff and students. Students will need their Suffolk username and password to access **SU\_Student\_WPA2**. Faculty and staff must use their Suffolk desktop username and password to access **SU\_Staff\_WPA2**.

## Step 1



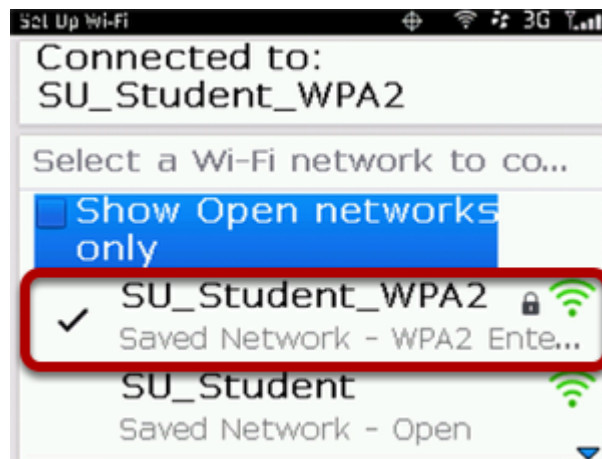
Go to *Manage Connections* and click on the wireless icon.

## Step 2



Check the *Wi-Fi* box if not checked. This will scan for available networks.

### Step 3



Once the scan is complete, select **SU\_Student\_WPA2** or **SU\_Staff\_WPA2** from the list of available networks.
